

# Riverlinx Camp Information

### Purpose

The purpose of Riverlinx is for students to deeply engage in learning about the River Murray by accessing expert knowledge, immersion in hands-on experience and by linking with children that live on the River Murray.

### **Our Sustainability Vision Statement**

'Our vision is to **work together** and share in being lifelong learners and teachers of sustainability. We believe it is our **responsibility** to **honestly respect** the Earth, reducing our impact for future generations.'

### Fees

We charge a fee of \$25.00 per student for a day visit, \$55.00 per student for a two day camp (1 night). This includes catering, accommodation, Loch Luna Cruises and bus travel to and from Banrock Station, leaders and expert fees that may be required. One leader per group free. Any additional adults same fee as students.

### Activities

All activities are run by Kingston-on-Murray Primary School staff, trained students or experts in certain aspects of the river (scientists, project officers). Students will need to be put into groups of 8 or less for the activities with a maximum of 30 students. The number of groups needed will be advised when the program is finalised.

Each visiting school staff member is assigned a group and is responsible for the behaviour of this group. At 4:00 p.m. most Kingston-on-Murray staff go home, however someone will be available if needed. (A phone number will be provided.)

### Accommodation

We cater for a maximum of 30 students. Accommodation is in 15 pop-up tents that are easy to erect on the Kingston-on-Murray Primary School oval. Each tent sleeps two students, which we will erect and take down if required. Foam mattresses are available for use; however, visitors are more than welcome and encouraged to bring their own sleeping mattresses. Visitors will also need to bring sleeping bags and pillows and any mattress protection for bed wetters. In colder months an extra blanket may be required. In the event of bad weather the classrooms on site are available for use overnight.

### Meals

Catered meals are from afternoon tea on the first day through to lunch on the last day. Please inform us of any student or staff food allergies as soon as possible. Students are to provide their own recess and lunch on Day 1. Please be aware that you are not able to bring fruit and vegetables into the Riverland.

### Bus

We use our bus for local trips out to Banrock Station etc. and this is included in the camp fee. Buses to and from your school is the responsibility of the visiting school.

### **Other info and Facilities**

Access to a full kitchen, bathroom with shower for staff use. Swimming Pool is available for use in Terms 1 and 4.

DVD/data show projector is available for use as well as sports gear.

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Deposit of \$400 required within 2 weeks of booking
Confirm camp workshop topics with Kingston-on-Murray Primary School Staff within 2 weeks of booking
Confirm dates and numbers of students with Kingston-on-Murray Primary School 2 weeks prior to camp
Inform Kingston-on-Murray Primary School special/diet needs by at least 2 weeks prior to camp
Send home and collect medical and aquatic forms if intending to use the pool (Please bring these on camp as they are needed for river activities.)
Send home list of things to bring, camp costs, invoice and due dates and payment options
Assign pairs of students to share tents (2 person)
Book bus for travel to and from Kingston-on-Murray Primary School
Arrange conversation 2 weeks prior to camp to confirm all details
Brief your leaders on Mandatory Notification, confidentiality, behaviour issues, protocols and risk assessment
Teachers bring medications, first aid kit, tissues, camp book, pencils, camera, whistle, aquatic and medical forms, mobile phone, emergency numbers, spare sunscreen and any 'after kids have gone to bed' special nibbles for staff well-being.
Pay remainder of camp fees to Kingston-on-Murray Primary School before camp

## STRICTLY NO radios, computer games, phones, lollies or extra pocket money, or MP3/ iPods – we will be taking everything else needed.
