FROM THE PRINCIPAL

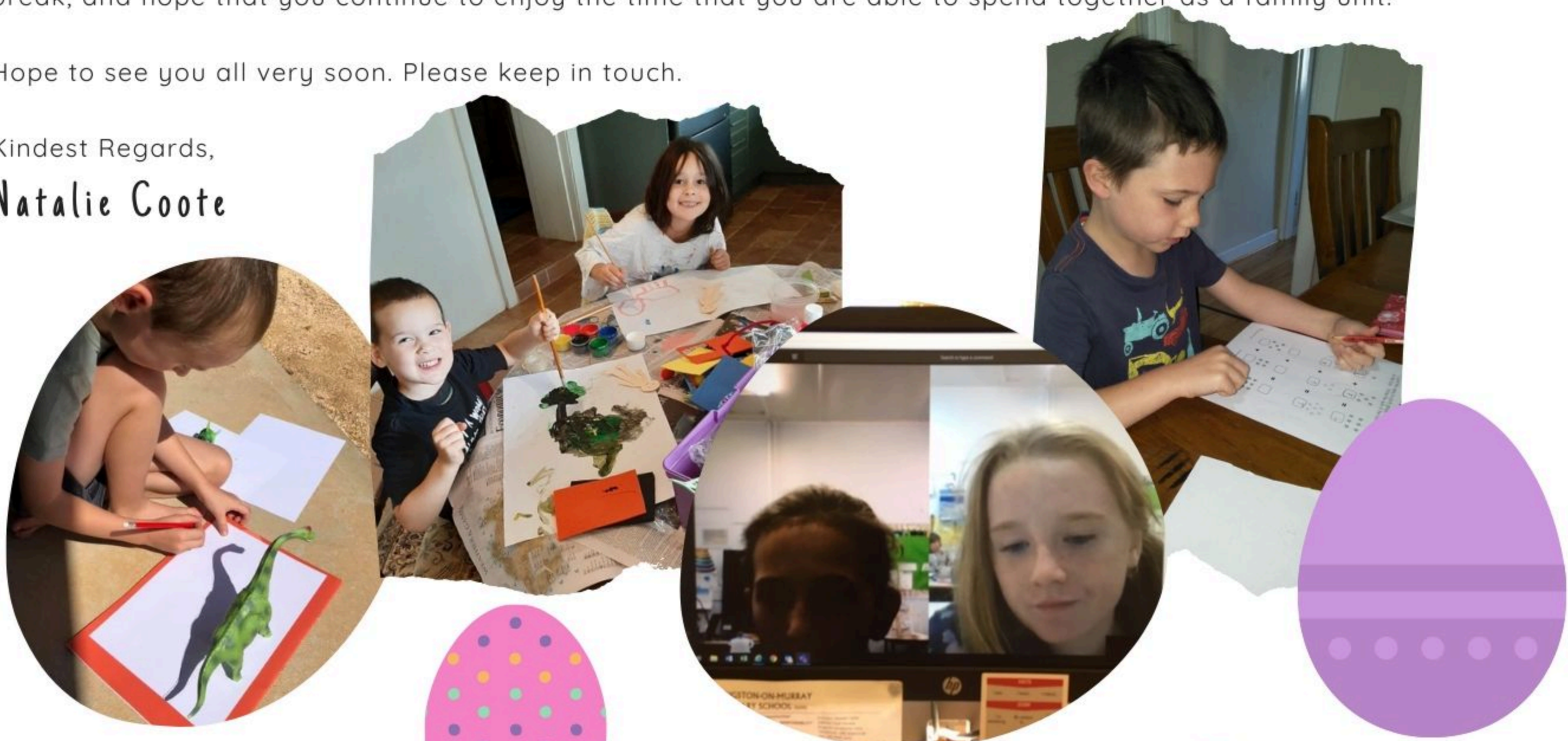
